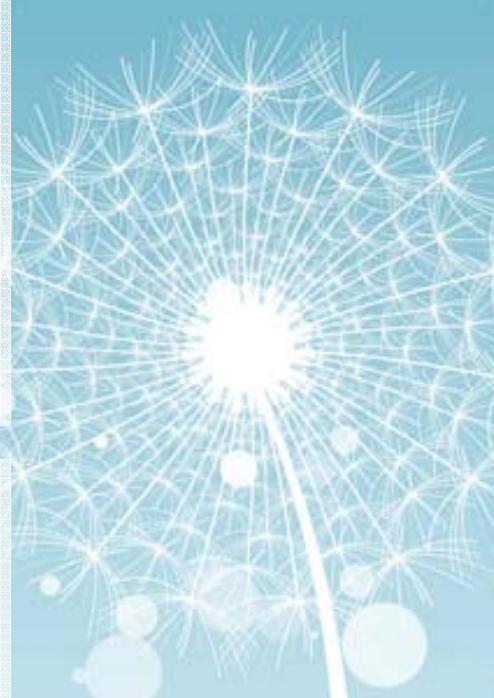

Let's Focus on Mental Health!

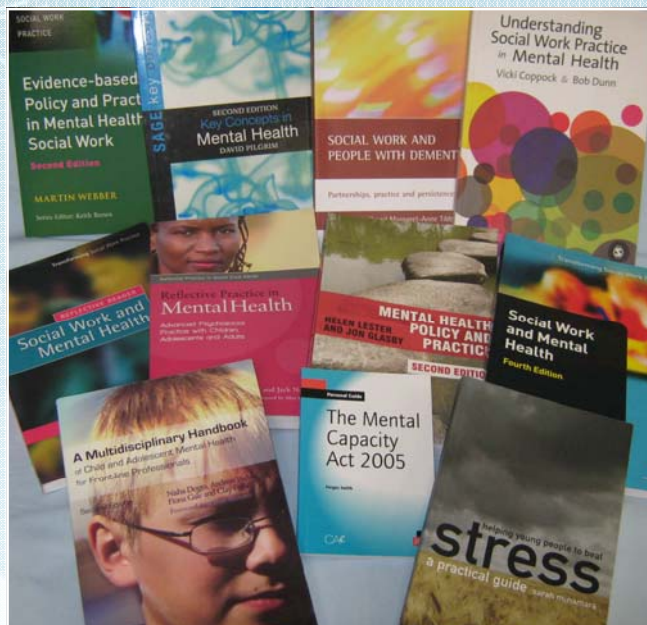
New, up-dated and relevant information for Student Social Workers, through to Social Care Managers.
