It works with families island wide that have children aged between 5 and 19.</p> <p>The service aims to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• strengthen your family's relationships</li> <li>• build your children's confidence and ability to handle difficult feelings</li> <li>• support you and your family to solve problems together</li> <li>• hear and respect your children's views</li> <li>• work with you to create a safe and nurturing environment for your children</li> <li>• show you alternative ways of dealing with your children and measure how much this helps your family</li> <li>• work together effectively with other professionals supporting your family.</li> </ul> <p>The service is available through a referral process usually through completion of a Common Assessment Framework-CAF. <p>Commissioned Child Health Services (School Nursing)</p>	<p>If you would like to find out more about services and your local School nurse team please see the links below</p> <p>The Isle of Wight NHS Trust School Nurse Team is community based follows on from the work of the Health Visitor &amp; works across health and education, providing the link between school, home and the community for the benefit of children/young people and their families. The School Nurse Team are qualified professionals with extensive experience of both adult and child care with a robust Public Health agenda. Each school has access to a 'named School Nurse', who has responsibility for a small team of School Staff Nurses and Support Work Assistants. The School Nursing Team delivers care predominantly in the school arena but undertake home visits if appropriate. At school entry all children are offered a health assessment accompanied by their parent/carer where health advice is offered on topics such as healthy eating; exercise; immunisations; behaviours; toileting etc. with appropriate intervention or</p>	<p>Contact Details: 01983821388</p>
