

More money for disabled children's services

From 2008 to 2011 there will be more money for disabled children, young people and family services.

This is what some of the money will be used for

- **1. £370 million for short breaks.** This means more disabled children and young people can take a short break, do new things and make more friends
- 2. £35 million for childcare. This means disabled children and young people will get better care
- **3. £19 million for transition support.** This means better services for disabled young people as they grow up
- **4. £5 million for parent forums.** This will help parents tell local authorities how to make services better


