30. Report of the Head of Planning and Regulatory Services

Consideration was given to the report of the Head of Planning and Regulatory Services, providing details of an application for a Premises Licence, received in accordance with Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

Details of any proposed additional steps to promote the licensing objectives were set out in the report circulated with the agenda.

The Sub Committee followed the agreed procedure, which had previously been circulated to all parties prior to the meeting. After hearing the application, the Sub Committee presented the following decision and the reasons for that decision.

RESOLVED:

THAT upon receiving the report of the Licensing section, oral and/or written evidence from the applicant, interested parties and/or responsible authorities and having regard to the Guidance issued under s182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Isle of Wight Council's Statement of Licensing Policy 2011 – 2014, the applications be determined as detailed below:

Conditions:

Application: A Premises Licence for Brawn's of Cowes, 62 High Street,

Cowes, Isle of Wight.

Resolution THAT the grant of a Premises Licence for Brawn's of Cowes.

> 62 High Street, Cowes, Isle of Wight be approved, in accordance with the application, subject to those conditions proposed by the applicant within the operating schedule as amended and agreed with the police and also subject to the mandatory conditions specified in the Licensing Act 2003, but modified to such an extent as the Sub Committee have considered necessary for the promotion of the four licensing objectives, namely by requiring the following conditions:

As per suggested conditions page B2 - B3 (a) - (j) of the report dated 1 September 2011 and amended as follows:

(i) Paragraph 10 (d) to read 'After 2000 hours the rear courtyard area shall not be used by customers for the purpose of eating, drinking or smoking and shall only be used for access to the toilet'.

(ii) Paragraph 17 (d) to read 'That the maximum number of customers permitted on the premises be forty four'.

(iii) To ensure that the French windows are closed and remain shut after 2000 hours save for access to the toilet.

(iv) Alcohol only to be sold ancillary to the consumption of

a substantial table meal, except for off site sales.

Reasons for The reasons were provided in the report to promote the Licensing objective regarding the Prevention of Crime and **Decision:** Disorder, Public Safety, The Prevention of Public Nuisance

> In reaching the decision the Sub Committee had regard to the Human Rights Act 1998, and in particular Article 1 of the First Protocol, Article 8 and Article 6. The Sub Committee considered their decision to be proportionate and necessary for the promotion of the four licensing objectives under the Licensing Act 2003.

and The Protection of Children From Harm, in particular.

All parties were advised that they had a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court if they were dissatisfied with the decision, and that any such appeal had to be made within 21 days from the date of notification.
