Decision:The reasons were provided in the report to promote

The Sub Committee was not satisfied that exceptional and compelling circumstances which justify granting the licence, it therefore concludes that it is necessary to the promotion of crime prevention objectives to refuse the application in accordance with S.120 of the Act and with paragraph 4.9 of the secretary of state s182 guidance.

- Application:Application for a Variation of the Premises Licence
for Ryde Theatre, Lind Street, Ryde, Isle of Wight.
- **Resolution:** THAT the grant for a Variation of the Premises Licence for Ryde Theatre, Lind Street, Ryde Isle of Wight be approved, in accordance with the application, subject to those conditions proposed by the applicant within the operating schedule and also subject to the mandatory conditions specified in the Licensing Act 2003, but modified to such an extent as the Sub Committee have considered necessary for the promotion of the four licensing objectives, namely by requiring the following conditions listed below:
- **Conditions:** (i) Not withstanding the variation no licensable activity shall be authorised after 11.00 pm until an operating schedule detailing the system for patrons smoking area has been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Licensing Authority. Such system shall be maintained thereafter.

Reason: as per reasons given within the same report in order to promote the Licensing Objective of Public Nuisance and in accordance with paragraphs 8.17 to 8.19 of the Isle of Wight Councils Statement of Licensing Policy of the s182 guidance.

(ii) To remove all hours of permitted sale of alcohol and, save any New Years Eve preserved rights, and replace with those detailed in the operating schedule of the application.
