Environmental Health and Police contained within the report with addition the even management plan shall be submitted to the Local Licensing Authority 28 days prior as well and also subject to the mandatory conditions specified in the Licensing Act 2003. In addition the Sub Committee have considered the following conditions necessary for the promotion of the four licensing objectives.

Conditions:

No members of the public shall be permitted entry (or reentry) after 23:00hrs

No person shall use the south gate after 20:00 hrs each day except in an emergency

All licensable activities except late night refreshments shall cease at :

0100 Saturday morning 0200 Sunday morning 0000 Monday morning

Late night refreshments shall cease at

02:30 Saturday morning03:30 Sunday morning01:00 Monday morning

Reason: The conditions are necessary for using the adequate promotion of the crime and disorder and public nuisance objective. Members believe the use of the north gate after 20:00 will reduce potential nuisance away from people leaving the event late and any risk of nuisance away from people arriving intoxicated at a late hour. It is also considered the reduction in hours will minimise potential for noise nuisance to persons in the vicinity.
