Application:

An application for the grant of a Temporary Event Notice submitted by Mr Ross Edgerton, Newport, Isle of Wight for a catering trailer to be located at the front of the Riverside Centre, Newport Quay, Newport, Isle of Wight.

Resolution:

THAT the grant of a Temporary Events Notice for Mr Ross Edgerton, Newport, Isle of Wight for a catering trailer to be located at the front of the Riverside Centre, Newport Quay, Newport, Isle of Wight be permitted in accordance with the notification received.

Reasons for Decision:

The Committee was satisfied that the promotion of crime prevention would not be undermined by the Temporary Event Notice.

In reaching the decision the Sub Committee had regard to the Human Rights Act 1998, and in particular Article 1 of the First Protocol, Article 8 and Article 6. The Sub Committee considered the decision to be proportionate and necessary for the promotion of the licensing objective under the Licensing Act 2003.

The applicant was advised that there was a right of appeal to the magistrates court, however no such appeal could be made within 5 clear working days of the event.
