33. Public Question Time

Questions were put to the Chairman as follows:

Mr Roy Scott of Newport asked if the Committee would be undertaking a site visit prior to consideration of the wind turbine application for Parkhurst Road, Newport.

The Head of Planning and Regulatory Services indicated that the Committee had previously visited other mainland sites and he would advise them as appropriate.

34. Report of the Head of Planning and Regulatory Services

The Head of Planning and Regulatory Services advised members that he had received an e-mail from the applicants indicating they were not prepared to commit any further funding to provide the additional noise monitoring and information, as had been requested within the committee report published on 11 December 2012. The applicants considered they had provided sufficient

information and evidence to support their position and therefore indicated they would not be attending the meeting.

The Committee was told that as a result of the changed position by the applicant, officers had now revised the recommendation to refusal on the basis of lack of information in respect of adverse noise impact.

Decision:

The Committee had taken into consideration and agreed with the reasons for the recommendation as set out in the additional representations, circulated prior to the start of the meeting.

RESOLVED:

THAT the application be refused.

Reasons:

- (i) Noise generated from the proposed wind turbine would exceed the guidelines for sound levels from such development contained within ETSU-R-97 and therefore would result in an adverse impact on the amenities enjoyed by occupiers of neighbouring properties. In consequence the proposal was contrary to policy DM2 (Design Quality for New Development) of the Island Core Plan Strategy and Government advice contained within paragraphs 9, 97 and 98 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
- (ii) The proposed wind turbine by virtue of its positioning, height and scale would have an adverse overbearing impact on the outlook and amenity enjoyed by residents of the dwelling located to the south of Trumor Feeds, Forest Road, Newport. In consequences the proposal is contrary to Policy DM2 (Design Quality for New Development) and Government advice contained within paragraphs 9, 97 and 98 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
