29. Chairman's Report

A written report had been circulated for information.

30. Items deferred from the last Council meeting:

(a) Motion submitted under procedure rule 10 by Cllr Lumley:

"The Council resolves to sign up to the 10:10 campaign, committing itself to cutting the Council's carbon emissions by 10% by the end of 2010.

We also encourage Island residents, businesses and organisations to do the same."

Cllr Lumley moved the motion, which was seconded and during the debate an amendment was proposed by Cllr Giles and seconded.

Following the conclusion of the debate on the amended motion a vote was taken, the amendment then became the substantive motion and following the vote it was

RESOLVED:

THAT the Council resolved to applaud the 10:10 campaign as a motivator of public action to cut carbon dioxide emissions through individual and collective behaviour change and in doing so reaffirmed its intention to deliver its own Carbon Management Programme committing itself to cutting the Council's carbon emissions by at least 4% a year for a period of 15 years.

The Council noted the recent decision of the House of Commons not to sign up to the 10:10 campaign but instead committing Whitehall departments and the public sector to delivering long-term sustained emissions reductions through to 2022 and beyond. Likewise the Council believed that its longer-term commitment, as set out in the Carbon Management Programme, demonstrated a willingness to address those issues over a prolonged period, and that should continue to be the local authority's focus for achieving the permanent reduction of carbon emissions.

The Council encouraged Island residents, businesses and organisations to support the aspirations of the 10:10 campaign.

(b) <u>Constitutional Matters and Appointments to Outside Bodies</u>:

Council was advised that the constitution required a number of amendments following Annual Council and that the opportunity had been taken to review and update the terms of reference to the Council's Investment Panel in order to strengthen governance.

Advice had been taken from the Department of Communities and Local Government and would take account of the proposed wider remit of the panel. It was envisaged that this would support decisions regarding the longer term viability of the pension fund. A proposed change of name to the 'Isle of Wight Pension Fund Committee' had also been included within the review, which would better reflect the responsibilities of the panel.

The Leader indicated a wider review of outside bodies with regard to the role played by Council Members would be undertaken. A further list was circulated and one further amendment was to be made, in that Councillor Margaret Webster would serve on the Yorkie Bar (East Cowes) Youth & Community Centre, not Cllr Edward Giles as printed.

In addition, a number of changes to the Council's grievance and disciplinary procedures had been reviewed to align with best practice which would mean the establishment of an Employment Committee. The Committee would meet four times per year and be made up of both Councillors and senior officers.

RESOLVED:

- (i) THAT the revisions to the terms of reference of the investment panel as set out at Appendix A, (attached to these minutes) and to change its name to the 'Isle of Wight Pension Fund Committee' be agreed
- (ii) THAT the appointments to the outside bodies as set out below be agreed.
