

**Income Deprivation**

This measures the proportion of the population in an area experiencing deprivation related to low income.

Outcomes were calculated through combining the results for the numbers of Adults and Children in each Lower Super Output Area (LSOA) who were in:

- Income Support families;
- Income-based Jobseeker’s Allowance families;
- Pension Credit (Guarantee) families;
- Child Tax Credit families (not in receipt of either Income Support, Income based Jobseeker’s Allowance or Pension Credit) whose equivalent combined income (excluding housing benefit) fell below a level equivalent to 60% of the midpoint for incomes, before housing costs were paid ;
- Asylum seekers in receipt of subsistence support, accommodation support or both.
