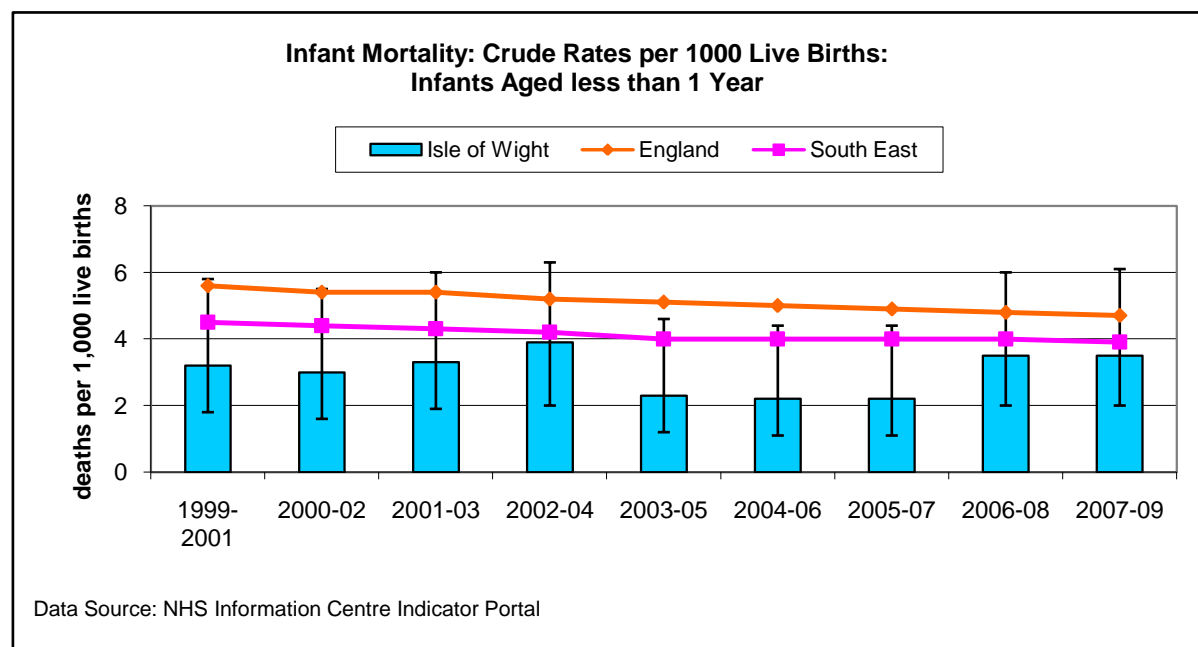

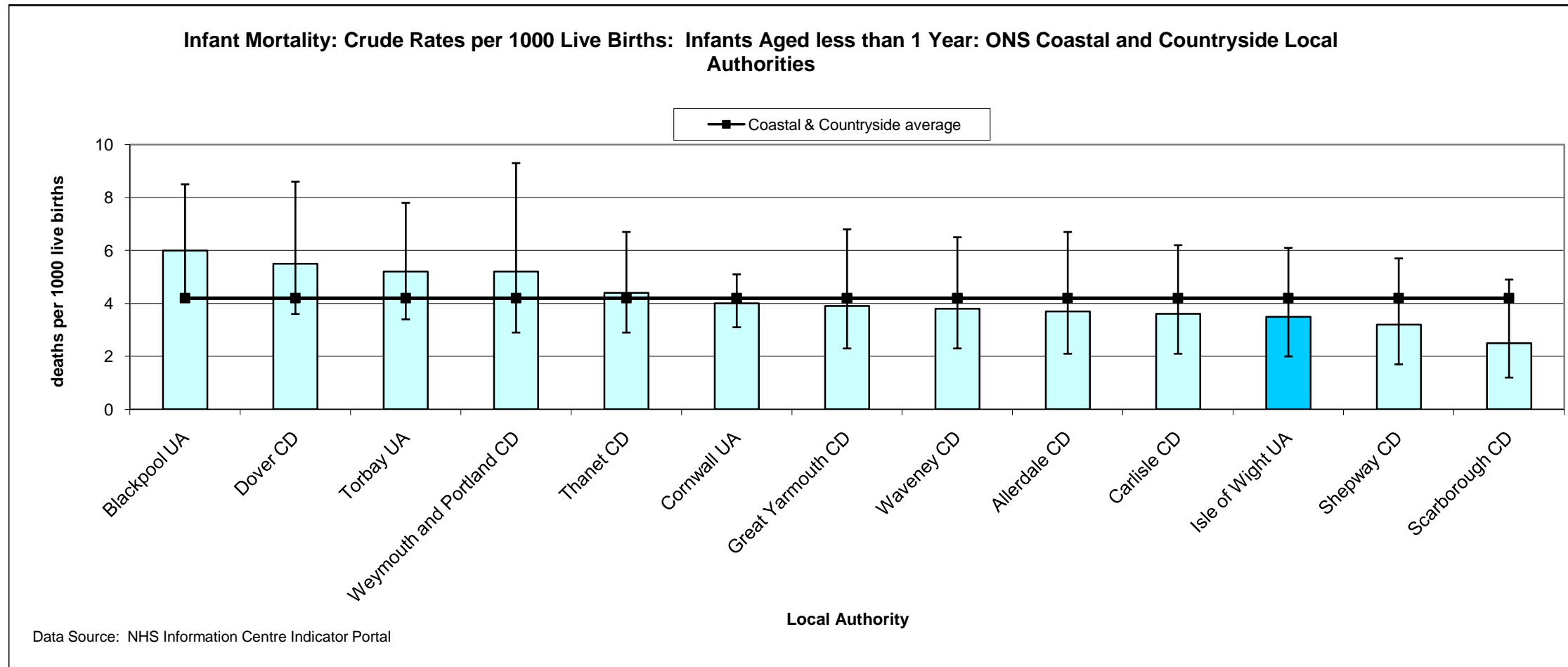

Indicator:	Infant Mortality rate among infants aged under 1 year
Background Information	The infant mortality rate is a key indicator of health, with evidence of inequalities in mortality rates between areas and specific occupational groups.
Definition:	Crude rate of deaths among infants aged under 1 year per 1000 live births.
Numerator (number of people)	Number of deaths among infants aged under 1 year registered in the specified years.
Denominator (total population or events)	Resident population for the specified years. Infants aged under 1 year
Geographic Coverage	Local Authority
Time period	As shown above. Pooled three-year periods are shown here in order to present more even trends over time.
