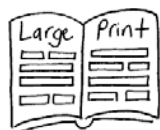

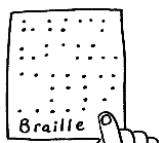

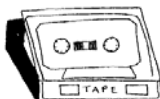

Do you care for someone? Can we help you?



Do you look after someone in your family?

Do you look after a friend?

Do you need help?



As a carer you can get help and support. To see what help you might need, we will do a Carer's Assessment.



A care worker will do the assessment. They can visit you at home.



The assessment will look at what you need to help you to carry on looking after the person you care for.



You can say what problems you are having and what sort of help you think you need.



The care worker will not tell the person you care for what you have said without asking you first.

There are lots of different ways you can get help. The care worker will talk to you about them. They will answer any questions you have.



How do I get a Carer's Assessment?

If the person you care for already has a care manager, you can speak with them about setting up a Carer's Assessment.



If they do not have a care manager, then you can ring the Adult Duty Team.



If you look after a child with a disability, you can speak with someone from the Children's Disability Team.
