Representations Received	Representations were received from the Ward Member for Cowes Medina who requested clarification around parking spaces in Newport Road and the retention of more parking spaces between Stephenson Road and Bellevue Road with restrictions only in place between 8 am and 6 pm.
	The Cabinet Member responded by advising that, following

	consultation with highways officers, what was proposed was the absolute minimum required to address the road safety risks in the area.
	Newport Road was one of the two main routes into Cowes and had high traffic flows which included buses operating every 14 minutes from early morning to late at night.
	The width of the carriageway was such that opposing flows of traffic were unable to pass parked cars resulting in them regularly mounting the pavement and thus creating a risk to pedestrians.
	The proposed restrictions were essential to address the inherent risks and would be needed 24 hours a day.
	Steps had been taken to explore every alternative that would reduce the impact on local residents and the net loss of on-street parking spaces was minimal.
	The Cabinet Member also stated that the proposals were supported by Cowes Town Council and that they should therefore be implemented.
