<b>Item</b>	<a href="#"><u>Consultation on the Future of Public Conveniences</u></a>
<b>Decision reference</b>	57/10
<b>Decision taken</b>	<p>(i) THAT the views of town and parish councils, communities and businesses on which public conveniences the council should continue to support (retained facilities) and which it should not (surplus facilities) be sought.</p> <p>(ii) THAT any surplus facilities identified following the consultation process be disposed of through the council's normal processes.</p> <p>(iii) THAT all responses to the proposed list of retained and surplus public conveniences (<a href="#"><u>Appendix</u></a> of the report) be made to the council by 31 January 2011.</p> <p>(iv) THAT a further decision be taken by the council in February 2011 to confirm the retained public conveniences and to set out the process for securing their management.</p> <p>(v) THAT a further decision be taken by the council in February 2011 to confirm the surplus public conveniences and to set out the process for their disposal.</p>
<b>Reasons for decision</b>	To enable the council in achieving public convenience budget savings of £100,000 in 2011/12 and £250,000 full year effect as set out in the Cabinet paper of the 7 December 2010.
<b>Additional reasons</b>	<p>To seek and consider comments from town and parish councils, communities and businesses about the Council's public conveniences which the Council intends to retain and close.</p> <p>To align with the following corporate themes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A healthy and supportive Island</li> <li>• A safe and well-kept Island</li> </ul>
<b>Options considered and rejected</b>	Option (vi) - The Council confirms that the public conveniences it will continue to support (retained facilities) and those it will not support (surplus facilities) shall be as listed in the <a href="#"><u>Appendix</u></a> of the report.

	Option (vii) - The Council will continue to directly provide only the retained public conveniences. Option (viii) - All surplus public conveniences will close permanently on 31 March 2011
