Additional reasons	The introduction of FPNs for offences outlined in the Policy will enhance the prospect of effective enforcement of environmental offences. This approach will also assist in avoiding costly court cases, however it will also ensure court action is taken where it is appropriate to do so.
	It is planned that officers will commence the use of FPNs with effect from 7 January 2008. Before FPNs can be issued all officers will

	need to be trained, publicity will need to have been undertaken and all the support services put in place. To implement the approved option from the Policy Commission for Safer Communities blue paper on corporate enforcement (saf4/05) to undertake a full review of environmental crime enforcement, to clearly establish roles and responsibilities for education and enforcement of environmental crime.
