1/03 DISPOSAL OF 34 HIGH STREET, VENTNOR

2/03 LAND ACQUISTION FOR SEAVIEW DUVER COAST PROTECTION SCHEME

The Isle of Wight Council had powers to carry out coastal protection works under the Coast Protection Act 1949. The proposed land was required for construction purposes and for environmental mitigation as a coastal protection scheme along 550 metres frontage between Oakhill Road and Bluett Avenue, Seaview. The Council had already approved a submission of an application to DEFRA for the coast protection scheme and formal approval had now been granted. The road, seawall and part of the foreshore would be acquired for a nominal sum of £1 and the fifty year lease for the marshland would be at a peppercorn rent.

3/03 SALE OF LAND TO REAR OF 182 YORK AVENUE, EAST COWES

The Council sold 182 York Avenue in 1999 and an area of garden land to the rear was withheld from the sale to safeguard the Council's interest should an extension to Osborne Cottage car park be required. This had not materialised and the land was now surplus to requirements. A request had been received from the owners of 182 York Avenue, East Cowes, to purchase a small area of garden land that they currently licensed from the Council. The land had been valued at £2,250. The Council's Asset Management Plan encouraged the sale of 'non-operational' land.
