	<ul> <li>Relocate the SEN and Early Years' Services to separate accommodation on the same site.</li> </ul>
	The site proposed is Berry Hill, Lake, Sandown, PO36 9LH.
	<ul> <li>To establish a separate provision for a maximum of 25 children and young people with statements for behaviour, social, emotional difficulties who have been excluded or are in danger of exclusion from mainstream school or who are in need of a period of intensive support before return to schools on the Island.</li> </ul>
	To establish an operational base on the same site for a number of specialist services that work extensively with these pupils.
	<ul> <li>The site being proposed for this provision is Love Lane, Cowes, PO31 7ET.</li> </ul>
