A review of local government electoral arrangements for the Isle of Wight has just begun. Its aim is to make sure that, where possible, every councillor represents the same number of electors. It will also take into account the interests and identities of local communities in this area.

To do this, the review will look at:

- the number of councillors on the council
- the number of councillors in each ward
- the boundaries and names of wards
- the electoral arrangements of parish and town councils

During this first stage of the review we would like your suggestions for any change to these arrangements.

The Committee will then publish its draft recommendations. These consultation documents will be available on our website, in your local library and at your council offices.
