How to Join

You can use some services without joining, but to borrow items, just bring some ID showing your name, for example a driving licence, bank statement, or rent book. Before using the library computers for the first time, you will need to obtain a log-in from a member of staff.

How much can I borrow?

You can borrow up to 30 books and other items at a time in total, but there is a limit on how many of these can be CDs, videos, DVDs, talking books and language courses.

How long can I keep them for?

You can borrow **books** for **three weeks.** You can keep them for longer if nobody else has asked for them. **Talking books**, **CDs and language courses** are lent for **one week**. **Videos & DVDs** are available for **overnight**, or **weekly**, hire.

What if the item I want isn't available?

If the item you require is not available here, we can usually obtain it for you. Simply ask a member of staff, use a computer in the library or visit our website. If you can't find it listed, we may be able to obtain it from a mainland library.

Do I have to pay?

Getting information, borrowing books, and computer use is free. There are also hire charges for Videos, DVDs, CDs, talking books and language courses, charges for items kept overdue and for obtaining items on request.

Specially for younger people

The children's library has books, videos, DVDs and talking books for all ages. There is a regular story time on a Saturday afternoon for the under 6s, a 'Rhymetime' for babies on a Tuesday morning, and other activities during school holidays, involving stories, games and crafts. Under 16s are not charged fines on overdue children's books. There is a separate section for Young Adults, with popular titles and books to help with GCSEs and A-Levels.
