**PROPOSED WIND FARM AT WELLOW**

This is an objection to the proposed wind farm development at Wellow from the Yarmouth Harbour Commissioners on two counts.

1. The Yarmouth Harbour Commissioners who have responsibility for Yarmouth Harbour and the Western Yar river, have not been consulted in any way about this proposed development.
2. The Yarmouth Harbour Commissioners believe it is necessary to conduct a field study of the likely effect of "run off" water from the proposed development.

The Commissioners believe that such "run off" water is likely to run into Thorley Brook and hence into the River Yar exacerbating the risk of flash floods in the Yarmouth area. In addition the Commissioners believe that any such "run off" water will take sediment with it into the River Yar and thus increase the likelihood of a dredging requirement in the river, and consequent extra cost for Yarmouth Harbour Commissioners.
