If I were elected to either the Youth Parliament or Youth Council, the main thing I would hope to achieve would be a drastic change in the attitudes towards young people on public transport, primarily the buses. The ability to use the Island's bus services quickly and efficiently is essential for the majority of young people, as many of us use the buses to travel to and from school or college, and other important events. From speaking to my peers and other young people across the Island, it has become clear that many feel that the prices charged by the Island's bus companies are far too expensive. Furthermore, people often find that the driver's requests to see a form of ID are made in a rude, unreasonable manor, and there appears to be a lack of agreement between drivers as to what is an acceptable form of identification. By changing the way young people are treated on the buses, I hope to improve the quality of day to day life for many young people across the Island.

Overall, people should vote for me because I am dedicated to improving the quality of the services available to young people island wide and passionate about listening to and voicing the opinions of young people all across the island.
